

# Book Club Discussion Guide

## **GENERAL DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

(for group discussion)

- 1. **How did your perception of Hannah shift over the course of the novel?** What did you admire most about her, and what frustrated you?
- 2. **Sloane's journey is marked by secrecy, control, and isolation.** How did these traits serve her? How did they harm her?
- 3. Reine Island serves as more than just a setting—it becomes a character of its own. How did the island shape the story, and how did it affect Hannah's healing process?
- 4. **Family, both biological and found, plays a major role.** What did you notice about the contrast between Hannah's family and Sloane's experience of family?
- 5. Several characters (Simone, Lisa, Silas) carry secrets or deep inner convictions. How does the book handle the tension between secrecy and truth-telling?
- 6. The story ends in forgiveness and renewal, but not without struggle. What did you think about the way forgiveness was portrayed—was it realistic, idealized, or something else?

## "WHAT WOULD YOU DO?" SCENARIOS

(for group discussion)

- 1. If you were in Hannah's position after discovering Sloane's betrayal, would you have sought refuge on Reine Island—or tried to rebuild your life elsewhere? Why?
- 2. If you were Simone, would you have risked everything to bring down Nicolo—even if it meant aligning with someone as unpredictable as Sloane?
- 3. If you were Celeste, secretly married to Cooper and finally embraced by a real family, would you confess your fears about not belonging—or keep quiet and hope no one noticed?
- 4. If you were Silas, struggling with your past and hesitant to trust your own emotions, would you have allowed yourself to pursue a relationship with someone like Sloane—someone still in the process of healing? What would you have done in his place?

#### **DEEPER REFLECTION PROMPTS**

(for personal reflection and journaling)

- 1. When in your own life have you needed to choose faith over feelings? What helped you do it—or what held you back?
- 2. Have you ever experienced betrayal from someone you trusted deeply? How did you process that pain? Has forgiveness played a role in your healing?
- 3. **Sloane's redemption is gradual and often resisted.** Have you ever felt like you were too far gone to be welcomed back? How does the Gospel speak into that?
- 4. Hannah begins the novel with everything the world calls "success" and ends with something very different. How do you define a successful life now?
